First Sunday of Advent



Dear Parents and Guardians.

Next Sunday is the First Sunday of Advent. Our spiritual direction in Advent should be to take notice of our tendency to be distracted from the purpose of God's coming namely, to bring hope to all people especially those who do not share the good things of life.

When John the Baptist was preparing his followers for the coming of Christ, he said, "In your midst there is one whom you do not know." Luke 3:16. Bono, the lead singer of U2, puts meaning to these words for us in an address he gave: "God is in the slums, in the cardboard boxes where the poor play house. God is in the silence of a mother, who has infected her child with a virus that will end both their lives. God is in the cries heard under the rubble of war. God is in the debris of wasted opportunity and lives, and God is with us, if we are with them."

So, when Advent looms up in our lives, we can ignore it and divert our attention to the commercial distractions or we can regard it as an invitation to reflect on what we truly need and long for in life. Advent invites us into a reorientation of life that means knowing God in a new way.

The Season of Advent is known as a time of waiting and preparation. But, if we reflect on it, life itself is a "waiting room". So, what "preparations" are we up to as we wait?

A final thought from the theologian, poet and Benedictine Monk, Sebastian Moore, "Christ is present to us in so far as we are present to one another".

"Lord, lead me to see, through Your love, the changes I need to make in my life. Break into my life and help me to move forward, perhaps along untravelled paths to new aspects of my life that help me to mirror You to others. Amen."

Child Safety—Protocol regarding discipline

Dear Parents & Carers—just a reminder regarding child safety, please do no not approach children who are not yours. If you have a problem or concern, please speak to

your child's class teacher or teacher on duty. Also please do not approach the parents of other students if you have an issue at school, rather let the school know and we will deal with any issues that may arise.

The following is an insert from the Department of Child Protection: "The NSW Child Protection legislation prohibits any adult from disciplining a child other than their own. This is particularly so when children are at school. Issues should always be brought to the attention of the class teacher, assistant principal or principal." Thank you.

Applications for Leave

Dear Parents, just a reminder of the following: Leave of 4 days or less should be requested by parents/carers in writing by email or a written note to the Principal. This letter of request should be addressed to the Principal prior to commencing the leave period indicating the specific reason or purpose for the request of leave.

If the leave is for <u>5 or more school days</u>, this will require a formal application for leave by completing an Application for Extended Leave form. <u>An interview is also required with the Principal prior to taking leave for 10 or more days</u>.







IT seems that the days of renting a suit, borrowing the family car and heading off to the school hall or local club for the Year 12 school formal are well and truly over.

In some instances, the Year 12 school formal has become a major expense with students (and parents) forking out hundreds of dollars for a one-night-only event.

The Year 12 formal has always been an important event in the school calendar. It marks the transition from formal schooling to the next chapter of study or work, and from teenage years to early adulthood. When I was at school, the formal was the reward for crossing the finish line in Year 12. Nowadays, there are graduation

ceremonies for pre-schoolers and "formals" at the end of Year 6. Aside from the costs involved, parents can really feel the pressure to ensure that the experience is a memorable one for their son or daughter.

Something else that makes the current Year 12 formal experience different from previous years is the role played by social media in sharing pictures and information about every aspect of the event. Many young people feel the pressure to look their best online. Sadly, it can all get a bit competitive.

No-one wants to spoil the delights of growing up or the rewards of finishing the long journey of formal schooling but sometimes I do think that it all becomes a bit extravagant, with the importance of the night easily lost.

Rites of passage are important for us all. We all should have the opportunity to acknowledge and celebrate the big milestones in

our lives, and finishing school is a big milestone for young people. At the same time it is important that we keep things in perspective and not make the event a fashion showcase.

If your son or daughter is about to have his or her formal celebrations, perhaps you could remind him or her that what makes these events memorable is not the dress or suit worn, where the event is held or size of the limousine. It should instead be all about having a fantastic time with those who have been important parts of their school journey.

Advent is in many ways difficult to come to grips with.

This is especially so in Australia where it comes at the beginning of summer, as the school and working years conclude and beaches and barbeques beckon. There is a tendency for the busy-ness of shopping, parties and planning for Christmas Day to overtake the rhythm of the church year.



Changes to Sydney's train network

We're making some improvements to Sydney's rail system to ensure we meet the needs of our growing city as part of the NSW Government's \$1.5 billion More Trains More Services Program.

A new train timetable will be introduced later this year and we've released a refreshed train network map to help customers prepare.





Key facts

1 Line direction labels

The map clearly illustrates a train's direction of travel in addition to its line — a need both regular customers and visitors have highlighted to us. For example, customers travelling from Wynyard will catch a T1 Northern train for Pennant Hills.



2 Line colour adjustments

Aside from the new T2, you'll notice some train lines on the map have had a minor change in tone or shade. This is so that customers can better distinguish between the different lines, making your travel even easier.

3 T2 Inner West extends to Parramatta

We're boosting direct access to and from Sydney's second CBD. The extended T2 Inner West, shown in light blue, connects customers commuting from Macdonaldtown through Croydon, Homebush and Flemington directly to Parramatta with no need to change trains morning to evening, Monday to Friday.

Customers travelling to and from stations west of Parramatta will be able to interchange at Parramatta for stations on the extended T2 Inner West. In the opposite direction, the T2 City services starting at Parramatta will relieve already congested T1 City services, meaning a faster trip for customers coming from further west on the T1 Western.

4 T2 and T5 changes for Campbelltown

T2 and T5 services will no longer operate to and from Campbelltown. This will allow us to operate more T8 services between the City and stations from Campbelltown to Macquarie Fields, which is the route the majority of customers from these stations use.

5 T5 extended to Richmond

The T5 now extends to Richmond because it will be the line providing services between Blacktown and Richmond late at night seven days a week. For all other time periods, the T5 will end no further than Schofields where customers can change to and from a T1 service to Richmond.

6 T8 Airport-South

The airport is a key destination for locals and tourists, so we've made it easier to identify such services with its own line code.
