School Commencement and Finishing Times


\$100 Sporting Voucher



RRAW is a public education campaign to highlight NSW road rules and direct the public to where they can find more information. RRAW provides an opportunity for all road users to improve their knowledge of NSW road rules, including any new or commonly misunderstood road rules.

RRAW 2018 will comprise:

- Media announcement a media release will be issued
- Facebook Live a Q&A event with Bernard Carlon, Centres for Road and Maritime Safety where members of the public get the chance to clarify any misunderstood road rules in real time. The event is scheduled for Thursday 1 March at 5:30pm.
- Facebook posts we'll be posting animations, infographics and other content regularly on our Facebook page (www.facebook.com/nswroadsafety) in the lead-up to, and throughout, the week. We would greatly appreciate you sharing any relevant posts across your own channels.
- Bus CCTV and train station 'crosstracks' will feature multiple choice road rule-related questions.
- Service NSW centres for the first time, quiz questions will be displayed on screens in 27 Service NSW
 centres across NSW. The locations were chosen based on crash data and represent the areas with the
 highest road trauma.
- Orientation Week events road rules awareness will also be promoted as part of Service NSW's
 participation in events at the University of Sydney, Western Sydney University (Parramatta), Charles
 Sturt University (Bathurst), Macquarie University, University of Newcastle, and the University of
 Wollongong.
- CRS website 'Top 10 misunderstood road rules' animations and brochure will be published on the CRS website.
