Complaints/Grievances Forms

Parents, please note if you would like to make a complaint/ grievance in regards to any school matter, you can pick up a form from the school office. All matters will be attended to under strict confidentiality.

Supervision

Before school supervision commences at 8:10 am. No responsibility can be taken for children arriving before that time. Children arriving before this time are expected to sit in the designated area. Supervision is provided for children during class and play times during the school day. Staff supervise children waiting for buses, walkers who cross driveways in the immediate vicinity of the school and those waiting for collection by parents.

Children are supervised by teachers until 3:15 pm after which time, parents will be contacted. It is the parents/carers responsibility to ensure children are collected before 3:15 pm every day.

Information regarding Leave from School

Leave from school for holiday/overseas trips in school time is not encouraged and must be explained in writing to the School Principal.

An exemption from attendance may be granted for leave taken due to exceptional circumstances (not holidays).

A leave form ("Application for Extended Leave") must be completed at least 4 weeks in advance if over 4 working school days. Leave forms can be obtained from the school administration office. Leave during school terms is strongly discouraged.

Leave of less than 4 days needs to also be approved by the Principal. Please write a letter to your child's class teacher outlining the details of the leave, including the first and last school day that the child will be absent.

In NSW, school attendance is compulsory for children over the age of six years until the minimum school leaving age of 17 years. Students must complete Year 10, and after Year 10 until they turn 17 years of age, students must be:

in school or registered for home schooling, or in approved education or training (e.g. TAFE,

traineeship, apprenticeship), or

in full-time, paid employment (average 25 hours per week) or in a combination of work, education and/ or training.

Try this fun way to assist your child to listen attentively.


Play the game 'Ask or Give'.

One person must speak on a familiar topic for 30 seconds, e.g. cats, while the other person shows good listening, for example, by looking at the speaker. At the end of the 30 seconds the listener must ask the speaker a question about something they said, e.g. "What do cats like to eat?", or give their opinion about something the speaker said, e.g. "It is a good idea to put a collar on a kitten". Be sure to model turn-taking.

Dear parents and carers,

It gives me great pleasure to inform you of an announcement made on 28th February, 2018 by Mr Gregory Whitby, Executive Director, CEDP.

Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta has been carefully considering the structure of our secondary schools in the Mount Druitt, Rooty Hill and Hassall Grove communities. This follows a review that has spanned more than two years with decision making being driven by the strong aspirations of the students in our community. Feedback from our feeder school communities over many years has suggested that providing an option for students to continue their HSC studies at St Clare's Catholic High School will be well received by students and their families.

As a result, it has been decided that <u>ST CLARE'S CATHOLIC HIGH SCHOOL will provide schooling</u> for students of YEARS 7 – 12 with a Year 11 intake for the first time in 2019.

CEDP considers that the changes will provide an expanded and more sustainable schooling model to meet the needs of the students in the community and ensure a new approach to deliver the very best skills and vocational training for young people.

A building and/or renovation program will be implemented at St Clare's to ensure that it is equipped with the learning spaces and facilities to meet the aspirations of its students.

OPEN DAY, 2018

St Clare's Catholic High School will be holding it's Open Day next Wednesday, 7th March, 2018 from 3:00pm to 6:00pm.

The evening is designed to provide more information about St Clare's and the opportunity for interested parents and carers to visit the school and meet our staff and some of our students.

During the evening there will be guided tours of the buildings and classrooms of St Clare's. During this tour there will be an opportunity to see the work of individual Key Learning Areas in order to gain some understanding of the curriculum and material covered at St Clare's. Staff and students will be available during this tour to answer any questions and provide information.

This event is important in preparing your child's transition from primary to secondary school. This transition is one of many key events that takes place in any child's life.

How To Install Skoolbag On Your Smartphone

For iPhone and iPad users:

- 1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
- 2. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help.
- 3. You will see your school appear, click "Get" then "install".
- 4. The app is FREE to download.
- 5. When installed click "Open"
- 6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.



For Android users:

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.

- 1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device
- 2. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using suburb name will help.
- 3. Click the school name when it appears in the search.
- 4. Click the "Install" button.
- 5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).
- Click "Open" when installed.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.

Please Note: Some brands of Android phones need the setting in "Notification Manager" changed to "Allow" instead of "Notify" in order for the push notifications to work. The phone must also be running at least version 4 system software to run the app.

For Windows 81 Phone and Windows 81 or 10 device users:

- 1. Go to the Windows Store on your 81 Windows Phone or Windows 81/10 Device
- 2. Search for "Skoolbag" in the keyword app search
- 3. Install the Skoolbag app
- 4. Find your school either by using the keyword search or location service.
- 5. Click the "Pin" icon to pin the school tile to your Windows Phone home screen.
- 6. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup"
- 7. Toggle the Push Categories that are applicable to you by tapping the on/off switch.

Does your child catch a school bus? Help them keep it!

As the bus operator that providing your child's school bus services, we're asking for your help getting your child to use their Opal card on every bus trip.

Since the introduction of the School Opal card in 2016, school bus patronage data has significantly dropped. This is not reflected in the number of students actually travelling on our buses for various reasons a large number of students are consistently not using their Opal cards as they should be.

Opal data gathered by tapping on and off is used by transport planners and service schedulers to design the bus network that best serves the community utilising the resources available.

If students don't tap on and off then school bus services will appear underutilised and may be considered for cancellation based on low passenger numbers.

Please help us reinforce the message that tapping on and off every bus journey with an Opal card is essential to travel on the bus. This will ensure school services continue to be planned for the students that use it, providing the journey to school your children depend on.

To help us achieve this, please talk with your child:

- Ask them if they tap on and off the bus with their Opal card.
- If they do, congratulate them for doing the right thing and talk about why it's important.
- If they sometimes don't or never do, ask them why.
 - Are they confused about why they have to? Talk about why it's important, and that every tap tells the bus planners that the bus is needed.
 - o Do they forget? Help them find a way to remember, such as getting into the habit of getting their Opal card out as soon as they arrive at the bus stop or bus line.
 - o Is their Opal card at the bottom of their bag? Help find a handier place to keep it.
 - Are they influenced by friends or peers that don't tap? Talk about how they like to travel on the bus with their friends and how tapping is what keeps the service running.
 - o Have they lost their Opal card? To order a new Opal card visit www.opal.com.au.
