Dear Parents and Carers.

On Sunday we enter a commemorative week in the life of Christ, when the first day promised so much and what followed was certainly not the way his friends would have expected nor wanted.

Holy Week commences on Palm Sunday with Jesus' grand entry into Jerusalem where He was welcomed with such enthusiasm by a large crowd, who lay palm branches on the ground before him and shouted Alleluia. They were all on Jesus' side, believed in him and wanted to be near him.

By week's end that crowd was no longer there for Jesus; only a few women, together with Mary and John, who were gathered under the Cross. Even his disciples had deserted or denied him.

Maybe this is something that has happened in our life when we find it hard to have the strength to stand up for what is right.

Are we easily swayed with the crowd or with the modern day crowd of the media? Popular opinion is not always the correct opinion and this is the challenge when teaching our children what is right and wrong. Teaching them to follow the right example.

Fortunately we are blessed in our community here at Good Shepherd by families who want their children to have strong values and live by them. Just recently we had two incidents where money was found at school and students immediately handed the money in to a teacher. This is great modelling by the children of what they should do. This is an example of standing up for what is right.

On Friday last week we were part of the National Day of Action Against Bullying and Violence. The children participated in activities, watched videos and were involved in discussions about bullying, what it means and how they are responsible even if they are a bystander.

Constant modelling by adults is important to keep these messages an important value in our children's lives. To act with justice, love and compassion are our ideals and not always easy. We don't want to be like the fickle crowd who welcomed Jesus on the Sunday but when things got tough turned away from Jesus. Are we good at sticking by Jesus?

#### Information regarding Leave from School

Leave from school for holiday/overseas trips in school time is not encouraged and must be explained in writing to the School Principal.

A leave form ("Application for Extended Leave") must be completed at least 4 weeks in advance for 5 or more school days. Leave forms can be obtained from the school administration office. Leave during school terms is strongly discouraged.

Leave of 4 days and less needs to also be approved by the Principal. Please write a letter to your child's class teacher outlining the details of the leave, including the first and last school day that the child will be absent.

In NSW, school attendance is compulsory for children over the age of six years until the minimum school leaving age of 17 years. Students must complete Year 10, and after Year 10 until they turn 17 years of age, students must be:

in school or registered for home schooling, or in approved education or training (e.g. TAFE, traineeship, apprenticeship), or in full-time, paid employment (average 25 hours per week) or in a combination of work, education and/or training.

As you know it is a priority at Good Shepherd Primary School to keep every child safe. Teachers have a duty of care to supervise children both in class and on the playground. This supervision commences at 8.10 am each morning. Prior to then no child should be dropped off at school.


### **Attendance Requirements**


