#### **Information regarding Leave from School**

Leave from school for holiday/overseas trips in school time is not encouraged and must be explained in writing to the School Principal.

A leave form ("Application for Extended Leave") must be completed at least 4 weeks in advance for 5 or more school days. Leave forms can be obtained from the school administration office. Leave during school terms is strongly discouraged.

Leave of 4 days and less needs to also be approved by the Principal. Please write a letter to your child's class teacher outlining the details of the leave, including the first and last school day that the child will be absent.

In NSW, school attendance is compulsory for children over the age of six years until the minimum school leaving age of 17 years. Students must complete Year 10, and after Year 10 until they turn 17 years of age, students must be:

in school or registered for home schooling, or in approved education or training (e.g. TAFE, traineeship, apprenticeship), or in full-time, paid employment (average 25 hours per week) or in a combination of work, education and/or training.

problem or concern, please speak to your child's class teacher or teacher on duty. Also please do not approach the parents of other students if you have an issue at school, rather let the school know and we will deal with any issues that may arise.

The following is an insert from the Department of Child Protection: "The NSW Child Protection legislation prohibits any adult from disciplining a child other than their own. This is particularly so when children are at school. Issues should always be brought to the attention of the class teacher, assistant principal or principal." Thank you.

All visitors to our school must report to the office and be signed in. The sign-in process must be completed using the electronic iPad system on the front desk. You must also signout when leaving the site. The information stored in the system is used as part of our evacuation and lockdown—keeping you and the children safe in the event of an emergency.

#### **Anaphylaxis**

As you are aware Good
Shepherd Primary School has
adopted a nut free policy to
protect its students. Due to the
presence of children who have
anaphylactic reactions, nuts
represent a considerable threat
to the well-being of some of the
school community. An
anaphylactic reaction can be

fatal. Could parents please further assist us by making sure that their children do not bring any nut products to school eg peanut butter, Nutella and other nut spreads, chocolate bars with nuts in them like Snickers, some muesli products, some cake or biscuit products—the list is extensive. If parents could check the labels carefully before buying products for school lunches, it would be greatly appreciated. If your child has an allergy and he/she does not wear a wrist band at school, please contact Mrs Doran in the School Office. (Wrist Bands are also available for asthma and diabetes).

#### **Student Supervision**

As you know it is a priority at Good Shepherd Primary School to keep every child safe. Teachers have a duty of care to supervise children both in class and on the playground. This supervision commences at 8.10 am each morning. Similarly afternoon supervision of children concludes at 3.15 pm. All children must be picked up by this time.

It is vital that parents seek a safe, supervised environment whilst they are away at work. It is not the responsibility of school staff to provide before and after school care whilst parents are at work. School staff have their own personal and professional responsibilities to attend to in out of school hours. Thank you for your support with this matter.



Could you please ensure the school has the most up-to-date paperwork on your child's Visa Status i.e. if his/her status has changed or if your child is now an Australian Citizen or the passport has expired and a new one has been reissued, please contact the school office immediately.



Due to the large number of performers (1800), audience seating will be strictly limited. Each performing student will receive a <u>maximum of 2 tickets</u> for their family or friends to attend. These 2 tickets are <u>free of charge</u> and can be used on the same night or one on each night. Each seat must only have one person on it. For safety reasons no toddlers on laps are allowed.

Each school has been allocated a maximum number of tickets per performance based on the number of students performing. Every effort will be made to accommodate your ticket preferences.

As seating is limited, the performances will be filmed and a digital copy will be made available to school communities free of charge at the end of the year. Copies of the professional photographs will be placed on the CAPTIVATE website. All filming and photography by audience members is prohibited on the night.
