Sparkling stars, rainy clouds, aliens zooming.



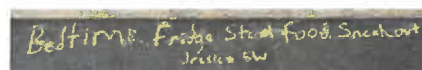

Uniform: Regulation School Uniform, Green Hair Ribbons, White turn-down School Socks, Black School Shoes.

Sports: Unisex Sports Shorts with School Crest OR Green School Track Pants, Short sleeved White Polo Shirt with School Crest, Green Sports Jumper, White turn-down School Socks and Joggers predominantly white.

BOYS

Uniform: School white short-sleeved shirt with lay-back collar, Black Shorts, Black turn-down socks and Black School Shoes.

Sports: Unisex Sports Shorts with School Crest OR Green School Track Pants, Short sleeved White Polo Shirt with School Crest, Green Sports Jumper, White turn-down School Socks and Joggers predominantly white.

The School Jumper with crest may be worn at any time throughout the year. The School Hat with crest is a compulsory school item to be worn every day. The School's Uniform Supplier is Lowes, Mt Druitt. Please mark all school clothing with your child's name to avoid lost property!!

Student Supervision

As you know it is a priority at Good Shepherd Primary School to keep every child safe. Teachers have a duty of care to supervise children both in class and on the playground. This supervision commences at 8.10 am each morning. **Similarly afternoon supervision of children concludes at 3.15 pm. All children must be picked up by this time.**

It is vital that parents seek a safe, supervised environment whilst they are away at work. It is not the responsibility of school staff to provide before and after school care whilst parents are at work. School staff have their own personal and professional responsibilities to attend to in out of school hours. Thank you for your support with this matter.

Social Skill of the Week

"Chew with your mouth closed"

Acceptable Hairstyles & Jewellery

Girls – Shoulder length or longer hair must be tied back and ribbons or a 'scrunchie' in school colours may be used. Hair colouring is not permitted.

Boys – Neat and simple haircuts. No undercuts, Mohawks, Number Ones, Lines, Rat Tails or Hair Colouring is permitted. Hair must be of consistent length.

Hair is a very important aspect of your child's appearance. Children must have appropriate hair cuts. Coloured hair is not permitted nor should hair be cut in steps or stairs, or have any other symbols or patterns. Long hair needs to be tied back. Green or white ribbons or scrunchies are permitted. No rat's tails or mohawks are permitted.

Jewellery

Only one plain sleeper or stud is to be worn in each lobe. No other earrings are permitted. One signet ring is permitted and a cross and chain or other symbols of our faith are permitted. Any other jewellery is not permitted, nor is makeup of any description. Parents are asked to please ensure that children attend school in accordance with uniform expectations.

School Shoes & Joggers

At this time of the year we often find that children need their school shoes & joggers replaced. Please remember if you are buying new school shoes, **they are to be black.**



If you need to replace joggers, they should be **predominantly white**. No fluoro or bright colours. For information on uniform and hairstyle requirements, please see website.

If your child is absent from school due to illness

Information regarding Leave from School

Leave from school for holiday/overseas trips in school time is not encouraged and must be explained in writing to the School Principal.

A leave form ("Application for Extended Leave") must be completed at least 4 weeks in advance for **5 or more school days**. Leave forms can be obtained from the school administration office. **Leave during school terms is strongly discouraged.**

Leave of 4 days and less needs to also be approved by the Principal. Please write a letter to your child's class teacher outlining the details of the leave, including the first and last school day that the child will be absent.

In NSW, school attendance is compulsory for children over the age of six years until the minimum school leaving age of 17 years. Students must complete Year 10, and after Year 10 until they turn 17 years of age, students must be: in school or registered for home schooling, or in approved education or training (e.g. TAFE, traineeship, apprenticeship), or in full-time, paid employment (average 25 hours **per week**) or in a **combination of work, education and/or training.**

A major learning and pastoral focus of Good Shepherd each year is making sure that every student is at school every day possible.

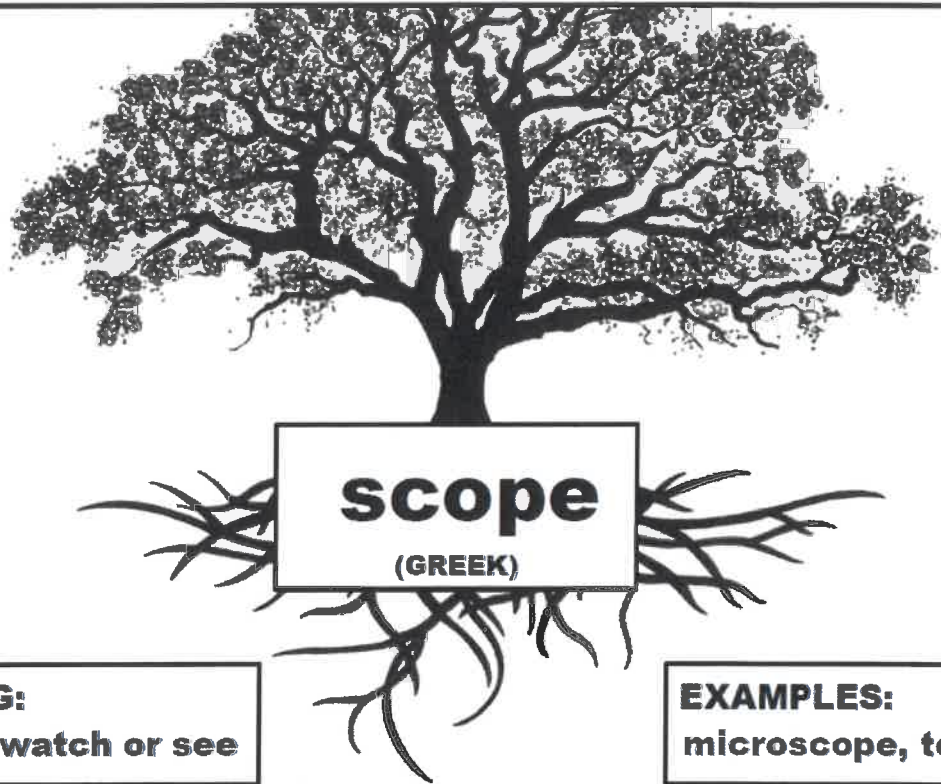
As you are probably aware, attendance at school has a huge impact on a student's academic success, starting in kindergarten and continuing through high school. Even as children grow older and more independent, families play a key role in making sure students get to school safely every day - they understand why attendance is so important for success in school and life.

We realise some absences are unavoidable due to health problems or other circumstances. But, we also know that when students miss too much school — regardless of the reason — it can cause them to fall behind academically. Your child is less likely to succeed if he or she is absent. Absences can add up quickly and if a student is absent one day a fortnight over the course of a school year they will miss 20 days of education, which is almost half a school term.

Missing school will negatively impact on your child's learning and results.

We want your child to be successful at school and we know that you do too. If you are having a problem with your child attending school regularly, please let us know. There may be ways we can support you in making sure your child attends school on time every day. Thank you, Mrs Carr and Mrs Cooke.

Numeracy Warmup

Array Busting Challenge

Equipment:

Small objects of the same size like lego pieces, dried beans, uncooked pasta pieces
Paper and pencils to record with

What to do:

Infant students take a small handful of objects. eg 13
Primary students take a larger quantity of objects eg 49
Students then need to use all the objects to make arrays (equal rows)
Eg. If I had 13 objects I could make 2 rows of 6 with 1 left over



2 rows of 6 = 12 and 1 left over

Purpose: Learning multiplication facts/division facts with the use of concrete equipment

Supporting/Extending questions:

Is there an efficient way of checking how many objects you have picked up? (try not to count by ones)

How many in each row?

How many equal rows are there?

What is the turn around fact? 6 rows of 2 and 1 left over

What is a sharing/division fact? $13 : 2 = 6$ and 1 left over OR $13 : 6 = 2$ and 1 left over

Do you know other ways to make arrays for 13? Eg 4 rows of 3 = 12 and 1 left over

3 rows of 4 = 12 and 1 left over

$13 : 4 = 3$ and 1 left over

$13 : 3 = 4$ and 1 left over

Continue making arrays and recording all the multiplication and division possibilities for one collection before trying another array busting challenge.

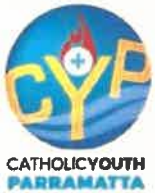

ADDENDUM - The Pilgrim Support Fund:

The **Pilgrim Support Fund** is a small shared way of supporting pilgrims who need some extra assistance to get to WYD2019. The idea is that 15% of each ticket sale goes to a central point. The WYD steering committee, consisting of our reps from schools/parishes/diocese has been entrusted to receive applications for support and allocate the funds. Those in leadership roles in our various communities of the diocese are encouraged to let us know of needs. You can do this by adding a brief note of support that applicants are asked to include in their applications.

As you know, however, some people who struggle most tend not to ask for help so if you know a special case like this feel welcome to inquire for that person. Primary Schools – About twelve primary school teachers will travel to WYD as pilgrims and hopefully be very enriched for their ongoing teaching vocation through the experience. Where a primary school is sending a teacher, they are welcome to use the schools' involvement in the raffle to raise a subsidy towards costs. With 15% of each ticket going towards the special *Pilgrim Support Fund*, the rest can contribute to your teacher subsidy amount. Any excess raised through that school community's raffle sales will become a most valuable contribution to the *Pilgrim Support Fund*. Primary schools without a teacher attending will be able to know that all of the funds they raise will contribute to the *Pilgrim Support Fund* (and/or they may unite with their local parish to contribute to specific local pilgrims. Kindly make sure to show this in your raffle reporting record).

High Schools – High schools will be able to use their participation in the raffle as a key means of funding towards their own pilgrims' costs. A 15% portion of all raffle revenue will form the basis of the special *Pilgrim Support Fund* and all else is available for specific, local subsidies of student pilgrims. Where there is an excess to the subsidies needed for that school, this will become a most valuable contribution to the *Pilgrim Support Fund* (and/or they may unite with their local parish to contribute to specific local pilgrims. Kindly make sure to show this in your raffle reporting record).

Parishes - Parishes will be able to use their participation in the raffle as a key means of funding towards their own pilgrims' costs. 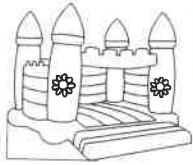
