

Sports: Unisex Sports Shorts with School Crest OR Green School Track Pants, Short sleeved White Polo Shirt with School Crest, Green Sports Jumper, White turn-down School Socks and Joggers predominantly white.

#### **BOYS**

Uniform: School white short-sleeved shirt with lay-back collar, Black Shorts, Black turn-down socks and Black School Shoes.

**Sports**: Unisex Sports Shorts with School Crest OR Green School Track Pants. Short sleeved White Polo Shirt with School Crest, Green Sports Jumper, White turn-down School Socks and Joggers predominantly white.

The School Jumper with crest may be worn at any time throughout the year. The School Hat with crest is a compulsory school item to be worn every day. The School's Uniform Supplier is Lowes, Mt Druitt. Please mark all school clothing with your child's name to avoid lost property!!

#### Student Supervision

As you know it is a priority at Good Shepherd Primary School to keep every child safe. Teachers have a duty of care to supervise children both in class and on the playground. This supervision commences at 8.10 am each morning. Similarly afternoon supervision of children concludes at 3.15 pm. All children must be picked up by this time.

It is vital that parents seek a safe, supervised environment whilst they are away at work. It is not the responsibility of school staff to provide before and after school care whilst parents are at work. School staff have their own personal and professional responsibilities to attend to in out of school hours. Thank you for your support with this matter.

### Acceptable Hairstyles & Jewellery

Girls - Shoulder length or longer hair must be tied back and ribbons or a 'scrunchie' in school colours may be used. Hair colouring is not permitted.

Boys - Neat and simple haircuts. No undercuts, Mohawks, Number Ones, Lines, Rat Tails or Hair Colouring is permitted. Hair must be of consistent length.

Hair is a very important aspect of your child's appearance. Children must have appropriate hair cuts. Coloured hair is not permitted nor should hair be cut in steps or stairs, or have any other symbols or patterns. Long hair needs to be tied back. Green or white ribbons or scrunchies are permitted. No rat's tails or mohawks are permitted.

#### Jewellery

Only one plain sleeper or stud is to be worn in each lobe. No other earrings are permitted. One signet ring is permitted and a cross and chain or other symbols of our faith are permitted. Any other jewellery is not permitted, nor is makeup of any description. Parents are asked to please ensure that children attend school in accordance with uniform expectations.

# **Information regarding Leave from School**

Leave from school for holiday/overseas trips in school time is not encouraged and must be explained in writing to the School Principal.

A leave form ("Application for Extended Leave") must be completed at least 4 weeks in advance for 5 or more school days. Leave forms can be obtained from the school administration office. Leave during school terms is strongly discouraged.

Leave of 4 days and less needs to also be approved by the Principal. Please write a letter to your child's class teacher outlining the details of the leave, including the first and last school day that the child will be absent.

In NSW, school attendance is compulsory for children over the age of six years until the minimum school leaving age of 17 years. Students must complete Year 10, and after Year 10 until they turn 17 years of age, students must be:

in school or registered for home schooling, or in approved education or training (e.g. TAFE, traineeship, apprenticeship), or in full-time, paid employment (average 25 hours per week) or in a combination of work, education and/or training.


# **Mackillop Athletics**

# **Numeracy Warmup**

# **Skittles Sort**

**Learning Intention**: We are learning to model, represent and compare fractions. **Success Criteria**: I can...

- identify what makes a 'whole'
- physically distribute a whole into parts
- identify the fraction of all partitions
- orally compare different parts of a whole.

**Purpose**: Working with fractions as parts of a collection. Fractions are used in different ways: to describe equal parts of a whole; to describe equal parts of a collection of objects; to denote numbers; and as operators related to division.

**Vocabulary**: whole, part, equal, out of, half, quarter, third, fraction, denominator, numerator, fractional part, equivalent fractions **Resources**: Skittles, M&Ms, counters, LEGOs or any collection of coloured objects.

**Task**: Grab a handful of Skittles and empty it on a plate. Estimate the number of Skittles on your plate. Only glancing at your collection, which colour do you think you have the most of? Which colour do you think you have the least of? Share your predictions.

Count how many Skittles you have in total (this will be your denominator). Organise the Skittles into colours. How many of each colour do you have? (e.g. I have three red Skittles out of my fifteen, I have five purple Skittles out of my fifteen). Write the amount of coloured Skittles using fractions (3/15 or 1/5, 5/15 or 1/4, etc.)

Supporting/Extending Questions:

Add two sets of colours together, what is the fraction of your collection when the two parts are combined?

How many Skittles are NOT red? green? yellow? purple?

What happens to the fractions when you take one Skittle away?


Compare fractions using >, < or =.

Tally your results and create a visual graph.

Once you have completed your tasks, you may eat your Skittles!
