<u>Uniform</u>: Regulation School Uniform, Green Hair Ribbons, White turn-down School Socks, Black School Shoes.

<u>Sports</u>: Unisex Sports Shorts with School Crest OR Green School Track Pants, Short sleeved White Polo Shirt with School Crest, Green Sports Jumper, White turn-down School Socks and Joggers predominantly white.

<u>BOYS</u>

<u>Uniform</u>: School white short-sleeved shirt with lay-back collar, Black Shorts, Black turn-down socks and Black School Shoes. **Sports**: Unisex Sports Shorts with School Crest OR Green School Track Pants, Short sleeved White Polo Shirt with School Crest, Green Sports Jumper, White turn-down School Socks and Joggers predominantly white.

The School Jumper with crest may be worn at any time throughout the year. The School Hat with crest is a compulsory school item to be worn every day. The School's Uniform Supplier is Lowes, Mt Druitt. Please mark all school clothing with your child's name to avoid lost property!



Information regarding Leave from School

Leave from school for holiday/overseas trips in school time is not encouraged and must be explained in writing to the School Principal.

A leave form ("Application for Extended Leave") must be completed at least 4 weeks in advance for 5 or more school days. Leave forms can be obtained from the school administration office. Leave during school terms is strongly discouraged.

Leave of 4 days and less needs to also be approved by the Principal. Please write a letter to your child's class teacher outlining the details of the leave, including the first and last school day that the child will be absent.

In NSW, school attendance is compulsory for children over the age of six years until the minimum school leaving age of 17 years. Students must complete Year 10, and after Year 10 until they turn 17 years of age, students must be:

in school or registered for home schooling, or in approved education or training (e.g. TAFE, traineeship, apprenticeship), or in full-time, paid employment (average 25 hours per week) or in a combination of work, education and/or training.





School Shoes & Joggers

At this time of the year we often find that children need their school shoes & joggers replaced. Please remember if you are buying new school shoes, they are to be black. If

you need to replace joggers, they should be predominantly white. No fluro or bright colours. For information on uniform and hairstyle requirements, please see website under 'Parent Handbook".


Kindergarten 2018 Enrolments—only a few places left

Numeracy Warmup

Greedy Pig

Students stand. Teacher nominates the number 1 as the "Bust" number. Teacher rolls a dice (I often use two dice with stage 3 kids and have two "Bust" numbers). Students add the number rolled to their total. Students sit when they are contented with their total. If the "Bust" number is rolled, all students still standing Bust and their total for the round is zero. Play three rounds. The student with the largest total after three rounds is deemed the winner.

Purpose

Fun way to have students learn addition of single digit numbers, then when adding totals of each round they are adding two digit numbers. It also requires knowledge of Chance and Probability.

Resources

Dice, student workbooks.

Vocabulary/Questions

Which addition strategies can you use? What is your total so far? (For this round/overall) What is the likelihood the dice will now roll a 1? Are you being a greedy pig?

When should you sit?

(After 2nd round) Who can beat (x)?

What is the minimum you need to win?

(When adding two digit numbers) Can you use a split strategy to add the numbers?

Can you use a doubling strategy?

Can you use a compensation strategy? (Friends of 10 and add on)

WHEN you think about the skills you need to be effective in your workplace, it often comes down to teamwork, problem-solving and communication.

These are the same skills we want to develop in all learners from kindergarten through to Year 12. In many of our primary schools for example, students are encouraged to work in teams on real-life problems. This is what we call an inquiry-approach to learning.

Often, a project will arise out of a question that students have been thinking about. When the problem or inquiry is meaningful, students will be more interested and more committed to finishing the task. In upper pri-

mary, teachers often coordinate the groups so that students are able to work across different grades. The focus is not on who a child is working with but on what the problem is and how to address it.

A common misconception about inquiry or projectbased learning is that students go off and do their own thing. That's not the case.

Students are provided with a level knowledge about the topic and a vocabulary to talk about it. Teachers are also continually observing what students are doing and providing feedback. If they see a skill is not being developed, they may take a student or group of students out of the group and give them a masterclass.

This means they can then go back and teach their fellow team members. This peer-to-peer learning is powerful because it provides students with a greater voice in their learning.

Feedback is critical in the inquiry model. Parents are invited in to provide feedback on students' final work. Students are asked to give feedback to teachers on aspects of the project they most enjoyed, least enjoyed and what they would like to see included next time around.

Schools need to be able to help students move from superficial knowledge (learning facts and figures) to deep knowledge (applying it in real-world contexts).

The value of inquiry or problem-based learning is that becomes a bridge between the two.
