With this in mind this year you will note in your grade newsletter that reading homework is compulsory. Your child is expected to read every night no matter what grade. The homework sheet is optional. Homework activities will be sent each week. If your child completes the homework activities, please return it.

We understand that students have after school activities and that families get busy, that is why we are making the homework sheet optional. We would much rather you spend quality time with your children after school and in the evenings. A family conversation after dinner or a game played together would be ideal. This is up to your discretion.

Information regarding Leave from School

Leave from school for holiday/overseas trips in school time is not encouraged and must be explained in writing to the School Principal.

A leave form ("Application for Extended Leave") must be completed at least 4 weeks in advance for **5 or more school days**. If leave is **10 days or more**, an interview with the Principal is also required, together with an Application for Extended Leave form. Leave forms can be obtained from the School Office.

Leave of 4 days and less needs to also be approved by the Principal. Please write a letter to your child's class teacher outlining the details of the leave, including the first and last school day that the child will be absent.

Leave during school terms is strongly discouraged.

Children Absent from School

In the event of your child being absent from school due to illness, please inform the school office by phone or email. It is necessary that a written note of explanation be forwarded to the class teacher on the day of your

child's return to school. Prolonged absences from school due to illness should be supported by a medical certificate.

Label Uniforms

Please label your child's uniform <u>especially</u> their <u>hats</u>, <u>drink bottles</u>, <u>school bags</u>, <u>lumpers</u> as many items are ending up in lost property! Names can be written on with a laundry pen, embroidered, or you can use iron-on labels. All unlabelled uniforms are washed and resold in the uniform shop. By failing to label your child's uniform, you are spending money unnecessarily when you need to replace these items.



Parents, students who are known to be Anaphylactic, Asthmatic or Diabetic wear identification bracelets during school hours at Good Shepherd School.

The identification bracelets assist awareness for all staff and provide a quicker response should any of these students show signs of these illnesses while they are in our care.

The identification bracelets are to remain at school after school hours. We would appreciate parents encouraging their child to put it on in class each morning and remove it at the end of each school day.







The ALERT! ASTHMATIC bracelet is pale blue, the ALERT! DIABETIC is dark blue and the Anaphylaxis ALERT! is red. If your child suffers from Anaphylaxis, is Asthmatic or Diabetic or has any other medical problem and the school has not been informed or you know your child hasn't been given the appropriate bracelet, we would appreciate correspondence from you so that he/she can be given the bracelet and his/her individual Medical Action Plan can be put in place. Thank you for your assistance.

Medication

If your child is taking regular medication including Asthma or is Anaphylactic or allergic, please note at the beginning of each year we require updated information and Action/management plans for these medical issues.

As part of keeping our children safe, it is vital that we maintain the most current information. Please take the time to update this information as soon as possible.

How you can help your child become the best they can!

Attendance matters—especially for children in Kindergarten. Studies show children who miss too many days in Kindergarten and Year One can struggle academically in later years, particularly if they miss 10% of school days. This can be just two days a month and can build up before you know it.

Poor attendance can influence whether children read proficiently by Year Three.

How you can help-

- Set a regular bedtime and morning routine
- Plan vacations during term break
- Schedule your child's midecal and dental appointments after school
- Make sure they come to school every day unless they are truly unwell
- Have a backup plan for getting your child/children to school
- Car pool
- Make sure your child arrives at school by 8.25 am, ready to join class lines when the bell goes at 8.30 am. Please note: supervision of students begins at 8.10 am every day!

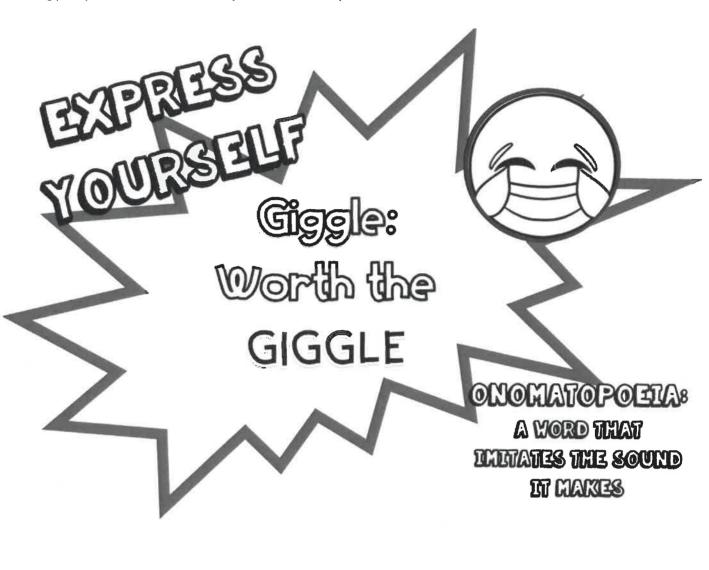

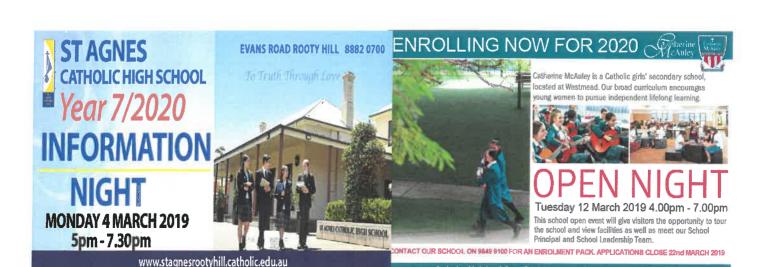




'Express Yourself'
