Information regarding Leave from School

Leave from school for holiday/overseas trips in school time is not encouraged and must be explained in writing to the School Principal.

A leave form ("Application for Extended Leave") must be completed at least 4 weeks in advance for 5 or more school days. If leave is 10 days or more, an interview with the Principal is also required, together with an Application for Extended Leave form. Leave forms can be obtained from the School Office.

Leave of 4 days and less needs to also be approved by the Principal. Please write a letter to your child's class teacher outlining the details of the leave, including the first and last school day that the child will be absent.

Leave during school terms is strongly discouraged.

Uniform Shop

Is my child too ill to attend school?

What signs should I watch for to see if my child should stay home from school? Sick children who are lethargic or whiny are often giving clues that they require rest at home to recuperate. Other possible signs of illness are fever, uncontrolled coughing, difficulty breathing, wheezing or persistent crying. Did the doctor diagnose a contagious illness that should keep your child at home? In this case, your child should remain at home until the risk of passing on the illness has passed. When can my child return to school?

As long as there is no fever or discomfort, a child with a cold may go to school, as long as they are not too uncomfortable to function in school. Instruct the child on the proper use of tissues for coughing, sneezing, and nose blowing. They should also be taught good hand-washing techniques, since research has shown that more colds are spread via contaminated hands than by infected droplets in the air.



Building Child Safe Communities - Forms for all Volunteers and Contractors

Good Shepherd Primary School is committed to keeping children safe at our school. A range of checks and undertakings are required for people who volunteer at schools within the Catholic Education, Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP). 
Children Absent from School

In the event of your child being absent from school due to illness, please inform the school office by phone or email. It is necessary that a written note of explanation be forwarded to the class teacher


be forwarded to the class teacher on the day of your child's return to school. Prolonged absences from school due to illness should be supported by a medical certificate.

Student Supervision

As you know it is a priority at Good Shepherd Primary School to keep every child safe. Teachers have a duty of care to supervise children both in class and on the playground. This supervision commences at 8.10 am each morning. Prior to then no child should be dropped off at school. Similarly afternoon supervision of children concludes at 3.15 pm. All children must be picked up by this time. It is vital that parents seek a safe, supervised environment whilst they are away at work. It is not the responsibility of school staff to provide before and after school care whilst parents are at work. School staff have their own personal and professional responsibilities to attend to in out of school hours. Thank you for your support with this matter.








Author Visit - Frances Watts

On Monday 26th August, Good Shepherd Primary School were very excited to start the week with an author visit. The teachers and students were thrilled to meet the famous Frances Watts. Frances Watts has written a variety of children's picture books and fiction books. Some of her books include: Parsley Rabbits Book About Books, Kisses for Daddy, It's a Story Rory, The Fearsome Frightening Ferocious Box, Goodnight Mice, Captain Crabclaw's Crew, and many, many more.







Frances Watts spoke enthusiastically to the students about her journey as an author. After studying literature at university, she spent nearly ten years working with some of Australia's most talented children's authors and illustrators as an editor before she had a light bulb moment that became her first book, *Kisses for Daddy*, beautifully illustrated by David Legge. Frances Watts likes to keep a notebook and pen in her bag ready to write down any ideas that come to mind while she is out doing everyday things. These everyday ideas become the inspiration for her stories. Frances Watts also gets inspiration from different parts of the world and especially from her love of history. Frances Watts wanted the students to know that they are all capable of reaching their dreams if they work hard and never give up.

The students and teachers of Good Shepherd thoroughly enjoyed the presentation and want to read more of her books. Frances Watts kindly signed the books we have in our school library. Frances Watts has continued to inspire our students to become authors themselves and to always love reading.

\$100 Creative Kids Vouchers Go Live

As parents begin planning for the year ahead, they can now access Creative Kids vouchers, providing them with \$100 for every school-age child to help cover the cost of enrolment for creative and cultural learning activities. Parents can use one voucher for every school-age child per year to help meet the cost of structured creative and cultural activities, such as music lessons, languages, coding, drama and theatre, photography and graphic design. It is now a requirement that all volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.


